Attendance Policy

The School requires each student to attend all classes as scheduled in the school calendar.

How to start

If you're just starting on the International curriculum, you can do some things now to help get ready for it.

Read every day

Read at least 30 minutes every day, in addition to studying and doing homework. Don't just stick to novels and fiction though. Get into classic major genres of literature including non-fiction like current world events and satire. This habit will pay off when you're involved in discussions and analysis work.

Get involved

You should be proactive in asking questions and getting to know your future school and its curriculum.

If a problem comes up, ask for help

If you have a problem that's getting in the way of schoolwork, ask someone you trust and respect for advice or help—whether it's a friend, family member, coach, doctor or teacher. If you're having trouble with a class, talk with a teacher.

Courtesy in the Classroom

1. Be on time for all class sessions, fully prepared and well-groomed.
2. Refrain from leaving early from any class session.
3. Act in a way which does not interfere with the rights of others to learn. Facilitate "good citizenship" among all students in the classroom.
4. Refrain from offensive behaviour and from using offensive language.
5. Ask questions related to the lesson. Your teacher will determine which questions are pertinent to that day's material and will be happy to answer other questions at

breaks or after class.

6. Allow others to listen to the teacher by not talking to other students during a class session. Our teachers have the authority to dismiss a student from a class session if the student is repeatedly disruptive or talking during the class.

7. All cell phones must be in an “off” mode during school hours.

8. When leaving your place to visit the restroom during class, please do so quietly after obtaining the teacher's permission and return to your seat as soon as possible. Do not use cell phones or other communication devices in the bathrooms or bathroom area.

9. Keep your place in the classroom tidy by cleaning up any tissues, drinks or other materials when you leave the class session.

10. Co-operate with the teachers and accept the authority and rules of conduct of the School.

Initially, subjects to be studied include: Maths, Science, English, International History and Geography.

Each student is expected to pursue excellence in acquiring knowledge and skills while embracing the School's values.

Through teaching and the practice of these values, we hope that our students will develop valuable personal qualities that they can use once they leave myIGCSE.

These include such traits as self-discipline, resourcefulness, adaptability, creativity, integrity, courtesy, self-reliance, healthy self-esteem, pride in personal appearance and public spirit. The aim is to use these virtues for the good of the School and the community.

The School's curriculum is both substantial and rigorous, designed to ensure students achieve a standard of literacy and numeracy that is comparable to high international standards.

The programme will situate the students within a participatory structure to enable expression through speech, actions and writing while paying attention to details such as accurate vocabulary, right answers and clear explanations of how these are derived. We will move students' construction from their private domain to a more public sphere by having students read and discuss their own work.
